Abu Ali Ibn Sino, the great scientist of encyclopedic knowledge, left to the mankind a huge scientific heritage that played invaluable role in development of the civilization. 'Today, after one millennium, his scientific trends of current interest and require in-depth study to be implemented in our reality.

The figure of the great scientist, his spiritual world and his ethical character in particular are example model for current young people.

Being an inquiring experimenter and unequalled healer he made a great contribution to various fields of science, especially to medicine, developing his knowledge on the basis of deep study of past experience and logical analysis of life. His views are an example of thinking and use of the ethical principles in science. During his short life period he made research in 12 spheres of the science and wrote 456 books (Said Nafisiy's information), more than 250 books of them reached to nowadays. 70 manuscripts of 55 works of Ibn Sino are saved in the depositary of the Institute of Orientology of the Academy of Sciences of the Republic of Uzbekistan.

After Independence of the Republic of Uzbekistan increased interest to study of the history and legacy of the country. Uzbek people are honored with the great fellow-countrymen and countrywomen of the past. Abu Ali Ibn Sino, famous in Europe as Avicenna, one of them, as it is known the scholar was born in Afshana village near Bukhara.
